Mr Magorium's Wonder Emporium is the first book in the classic fantasy series that began with the publication of *The Discworld* in 1980. Over the following decades, the author wrote a series of other novels set in the magical Discworld, including *Pyramids*, *Guards Guards*, *Feet of Clay*, *Making Money* and *Going Postal*, plus shorter stories such as 'Dinner Ladies' and the Christmas Special. And he also edited all the Discworld novels and collections. The books have won countless literary prizes and been translated into dozens of languages. Mr. Magorium's is a series of books set on the Discworld. The books have been translated into many languages including Czech, French, German, Hungarian, Italian, Polish, Romanian, Spanish, Swedish, and Finnish. The first Discworld novel, *The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy*, was written by Sir Terry Pratchett and originally published by BBC Radio in 1978. It features a computer called Deep Thought, and was later published in book form by Sir Terry's estate. The Discworld came to international attention following the publication in 1987 of his third Discworld novel, *The Colour of Magic*, the first Discworld novel to be published by a mainstream publisher, and the first to feature the Ankh-Morpork City Watch. It was, and remains, the most successful book ever published by a British-based company. THE DISCWORLD TRILOGY: *The Colour of Magic* (1987), *Guards Guards* (1989), and *A Hat Full of Sky* (1990) are considered to be some of the most important novels in the history of fantasy. The Discworld was not the first fantasy series to be published by a mainstream publisher. That was the Darkover series by Marion Zimmer Bradley.
